## **Edmonton Mosque Vandalized With Symbol of Hate**

## National Canadian Muslim Community shocked to learn of swastika spray-painted on Baitul Hadi Mosque

The Ahmadiyya Muslim Jama`at Canada is deeply troubled and concerned to learn that the Baitul Hadi Mosque in Edmonton was vandalized with a Swastika symbol.

As the community is still healing from the grief of the attack on an innocent Muslim family in London, members of the congregation were saddened to see this symbol of hatred on their mosque.

It has been reported that following the London attack, several other acts of vandalism and trespassing have taken place at mosques in different parts of Canada.

"We are deeply disturbed by the rising acts of violence against the Muslim community," said Nasir Butt, Imam of the Baitul Hadi Mosque. "This is not the way of Canadians, and we must work together to combat anti-Muslim sentiment."
